Last Sunday's Junior game was most disappointing because it was most one sided, as the Skipjacks could only field eight men at the start of the game. If players know that they have other interests on the Sunday afternoon, and cannot play, they should notify their Captain or team selectors. It is necessary, too, that a list of at least 20 names should be compiled when teams are handed in. Too many games like that of Sunday will kill the interest shown in Football. Those footballers who did play for Skipjacks, did well to hold the heavier Brothers, to a score of 25 nil. But, as the penalties show, Brothers often threw away an advantage by silly breaches. Penalties favoured Skipjacks by 15 to 3. Surprisingly, the scrums were even, each side winning 6.
