The bout between Stewart Frescon v Charlie Parker was won by Frescon on points after 3 rounds.

A 4 rounds bout between James Fournile and Walter Bingaroo was won by Bingaroo on points. Bingaroo is not boxing as coolly as in earlier bouts.

Another 4 rounds bout between Robert Ketchup and Alan Nugent was won on points by Nugent.

A 3 round bout between Morris Palmer v Norman Aden was won by Palmer.

The 6 round Fred Doolan v Max Simpson bout was won by Doolan on points after 3 rounds, partly owing to Simpson's lack of condition.

Four rounds between George Friday and Melbourne Mick was won by Melbourne on T.K.O..
