WHAT WAS IT?

A good deal of enquiry has been made in regard to the deep trench dug on the rise near the dairy.

This is a trench silo and has now been filled with approximately 50 tons of saccaline and corn which when opened later in the year will provide good fodder for the dairy stock. The saccaline and corn goes into the trench fresh and green as it is cut in the field and will come out in October or November as a black, sticky mass but very good for stock feed.

If necessary such silage may be kept untouched for many years and when opened up be perfectly sound fodder.
